

Visions, Prophecies and Divinations is an introduction to the vast and complex phenomena of prophecy and vision in the Spanish and Portuguese Empires. One of the first collections of essays on the subject to be published in English, this book is dedicated to the study of the millenarian and messianic movements in the early modern Iberian world.

The ten chapters range from the analysis of Mesoamerican and South American indigenous prophetic beliefs to the intellectual history of the Luso-Brazilian Jesuit Antônio Vieira and his project of a Fifth Empire, passing through new approaches to the long-lasting Sebastianist belief and its political implications.

Luís Filipe Silvério Lima, Ph.D. (2005, University of São Paulo), teaches Early Modern History at Federal University of São Paulo. He has published extensively on the Portuguese Empire, and prophetism, including *Império dos sonhos: narrativas proféticas, sebastianismo e messianismo brigantino* (2010).

Ana Paula Torres Megiani, Ph.D (2001, University of São Paulo), teaches Iberian History at University of São Paulo. Topics that she has extensively published on include D. Sebastião of Portugal, and the Habsburg influence in Portugal, Spain and their Empires between 1580–1650.
